

Evaluation Rubric for the Open Affordable (OAT) Grant Application

Quality	The primary selected resources are from high-quality, peer-reviewed journals and open textbooks. 3 Points	Resources are a mixture of peer-reviewed and credible supplemental resources (newspaper articles, educational videos, podcasts, etc.). 2 Points	Selected resources are mainly not from peer-reviewed sources. 1 Point
Savings	Selected resources are of no cost to students. 3 Points	Selected resources are roughly between 99-75% less expensive than the traditional materials for the course. 2 Points	Selected resources are roughly between 74-50% less expensive than the traditional materials for the course. 1 Point
Number of Students Impacted	100 or more students would see cost savings across all sections per semester. 3 Points	30-99 students would see cost savings across all sections per semester. 2 Points	Less than 30 students would see cost savings across all sections per semester. 1 Point
Preparedness for Implementation	Resources have already been thoroughly vetted by the instructor and a full plan for implementation is in place. 3 Points	Instructor has a partial plan for implementation in place. 2 Points	Instructor has yet to plan how the materials will be implemented in the course. 1 Point
Sustainability	The use of OER materials in the course can be repeated and can be shared with other instructors of the course. 3 Points	The use of OER materials in the course can be repeated each semester by the instructor. 2 Points	The use of OER materials in the course are only used for the semester of the project. 1 Point
Pedagogical Innovation	OER materials provide a new, transformative way of teaching the course. 3 Points	OER materials provide some new approaches to teaching the course. 2 Points	OER materials do not innovate the teaching in the course. 1 Point
